Craig Mitchell Director of Christian Education and Discipleship, Uniting College

Craig has a background in teaching, and served for several years as Children, Youth and Young Adults Consultant for the Uniting Church Synod (SA) overseeing youth leader and youth worker networks and key events. For the past 14 years he served as a pastor at Aberfoyle Uniting Church. He describes himself as committed to “doing whatever I can to assist in the formation of ministers and leaders for a Church that is called upon to take seriously God’s mission to reach out to others with the gospel of Jesus Christ.”



Liz Boase Lecturer in Old Testament, Uniting College

Liz is committed to bringing the writings of the Old Testament (Hebrew Bible) alive for people and helping them to see the relevance of these ancient texts for our current contexts of ministry and mission. She believes that in the OT we find many of the issues that confront us in our “quest to understand who God is and who we are before God are the same issues that are addressed in the writings of the Hebrew Bible.” Her current area of research focuses on the importance of prayers of lament as a means of people expressing their deepest distress and suffering before God.



Steve Taylor Director of Missiology, Uniting College

Steve enjoys coffee and vegetable gardens and travels with a kiwi accent, having ministered in congregational leadership in the cities of Christchurch and Auckland. This ministry included planting new forms of church, developing innovative community ministry and leading an established church through major transition in values, mission, facilities and staff.
